Project Overview

I-285 at SR 400 Interchange

- New ramps and flyover bridges

I-285

- Limits: West of Long Island Drive to the east of Ashford Dunwoody Road
- New Collector-Distributor (CD) lanes and bridges
- Bridge Replacements: Glenridge, SR 400, Peachtree Dunwoody
- Bridge Deck Improvements: Long Island Drive and Lake Forrest Drive

SR 400

- Limits: Glenridge Connector south of I-285 to Pitts Road north of Spalding Drive
- New CD lanes and bridges
- Bridge Replacements at Mount Vernon Highway and SR 400 over Abernathy Road
- Abernathy Road Diverging Diamond Interchange

Recent Accomplishments



Recent Accomplishments – I-285 EB to SR 400 NB

- **Opened in July 2022**
 - New bridge opened from I-285 EB to SR 400 NB
 - This shift places drivers into the CD lanes to continue onto SR 400 NB just past Abernathy Road



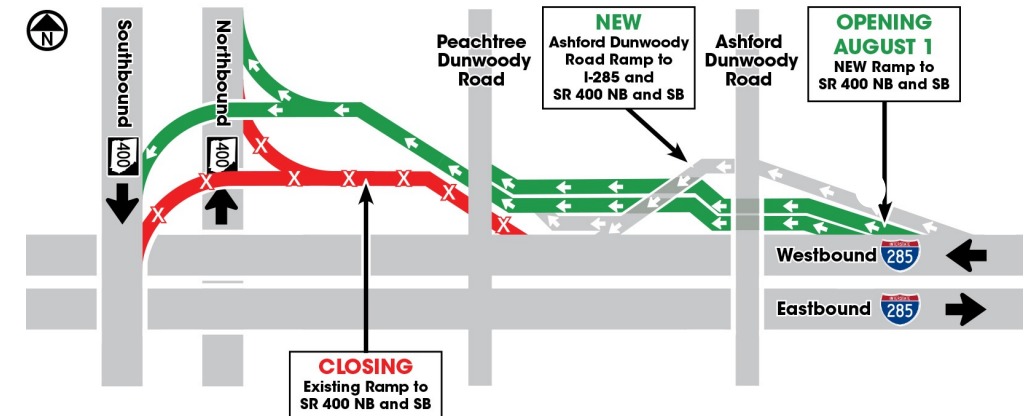
I-285 WB to Peachtree Dunwoody Road/ SR 400 NB & SB

- **Opened in August 2022**

- Motorists driving on I-285 WB to SR 400 NB and SB have a new exiting pattern (same exit as Peachtree Dunwoody Road)
- Motorists must make their decision to exit earlier just past Ashford Dunwoody Road
- This new exit point will eliminate conflict points

New Traffic Patterns



Recent Accomplishments – Abernathy Road Progress

- **Abernathy Road Bridge Construction**
 - Removal of current SR 400 bridge over Abernathy Road – **Complete**
 - SR 400 NB shift back onto the mainlines – **Complete**
 - SR 400 SB shift back onto the mainlines – **TBD**
- **Abernathy Road Full Closures & Ramp Closures**
 - Abernathy Road has made substantial completion over the last three months.
 - Different closures will be scheduled for the remaining work including full closures and ramp closures.



Upcoming Activities



SR 400 Upcoming Construction Activities

- **Traffic Lane Shifts**
 - SR 400 SB CD lanes to mainlines – TBD
- **Mount Vernon Highway**
 - Opening of one lane in each direction – October 2022
- **Paving**
 - Temporary ramp and CD lanes
- **Bridge Construction**
 - SR 400 NB will have lane closures (nightly & weekends) due to bridge demo and reconstruction as a part of the I-285 lane reductions work



Abernathy Road at SR 400 Construction Activities

- **Abernathy Road**

- Construction activities to finish up before opening to motorists
- Diverging Diamond Interchange (DDI) configuration anticipated implementation – Q4 2022

- **Bridge construction**

- Abernathy Road - ongoing



I-285 Upcoming Construction Activities

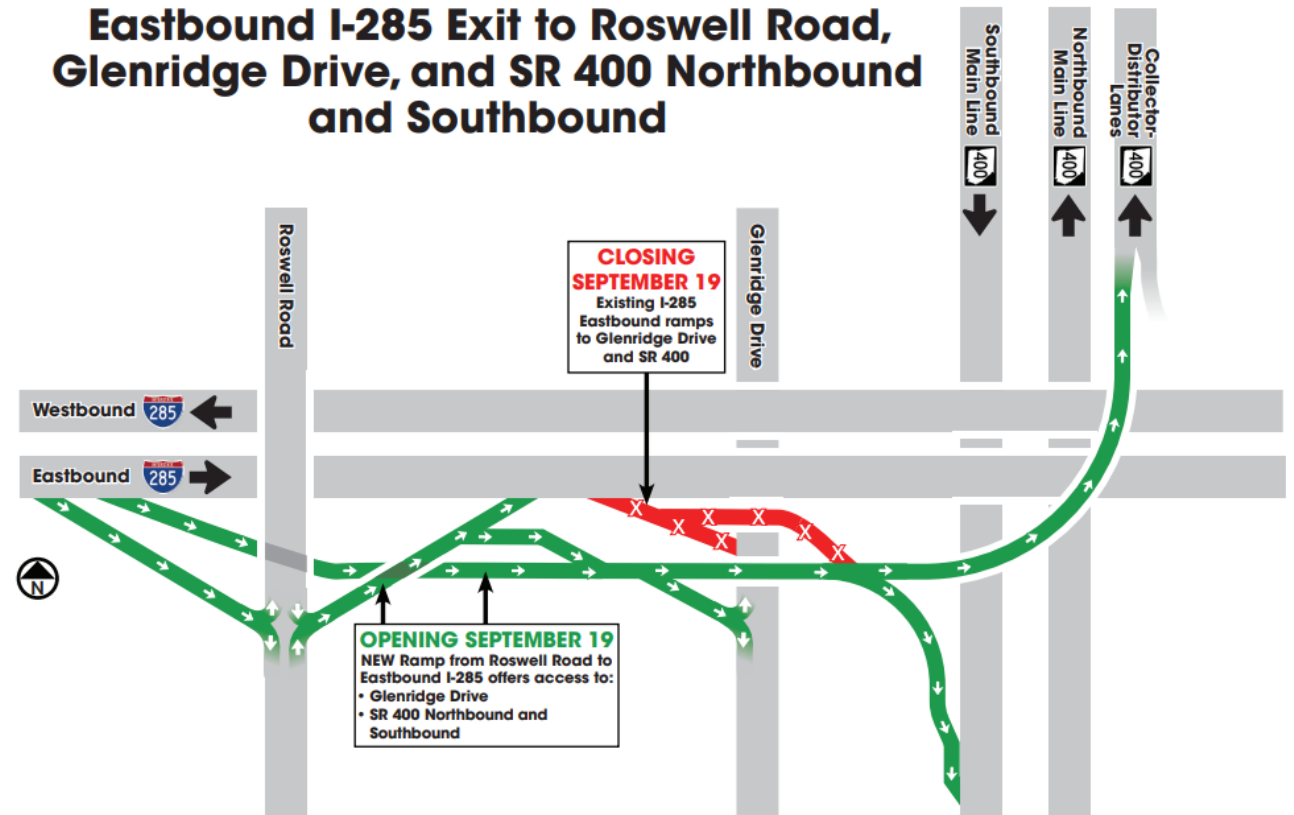
- **Ramp Traffic Shifts (Milestone Openings that must occur ahead of I-285 Lane Reductions)**
 - I-285 EB CD lane; Will allow access to Glenridge Drive, SR 400 NB and SR 400 SB - September 19, 2022
 - I-285 WB CD lane from Peachtree Dunwoody Road to Roswell Road – Work to establish the final alignment and capacity will continue
 - I-285 EB CD lane; Will allow access to I-285 EB from SR 400 NB and SR 400 SB – September 26, 2022
- **Bridge Construction**
 - I-285 WB over Lake Forrest Drive – October 2022
 - Bridge demolition and reconstruction over Glenridge Drive, SR 400, and Peachtree Dunwoody Road (I-285 Lane Reductions)



I-285 EB to Glenridge Drive and SR 400 NB & SB

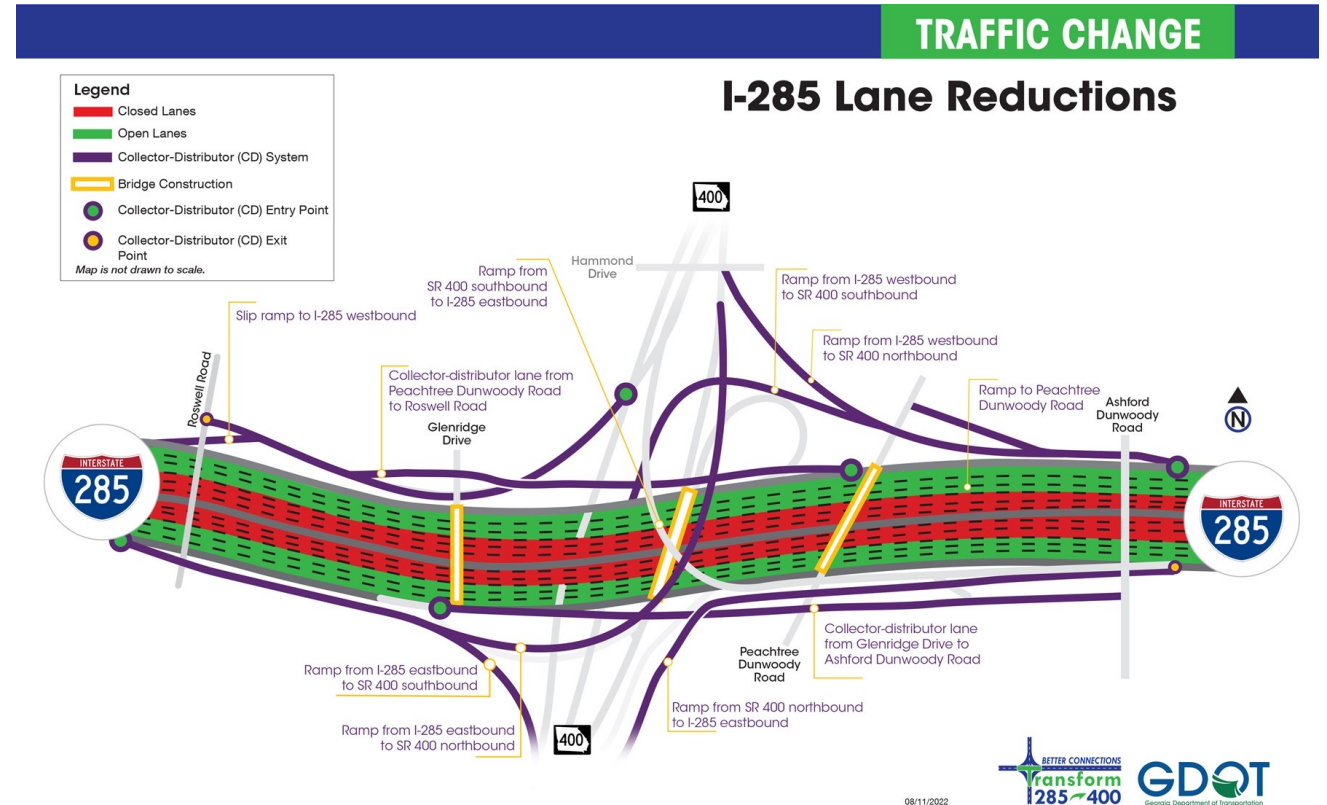
- Opening September 19, 2022
(Weather permitting)
- This new exit point will place drivers into CD lanes and will allow access to Glenridge Drive, SR 400 NB and SR 400 SB (Exit 26-27)
- Motorists traveling EB on I-285 must make their decision to exit sooner just before the Roswell Road overpass

Eastbound I-285 Exit to Roswell Road, Glenridge Drive, and SR 400 Northbound and Southbound



Upcoming I-285 Lane Reductions: Phase 1

- Limits: I-285 EB and WB from Roswell Road to Ashford Dunwoody Road
- Two inside lanes will close to traffic
- Crews will rebuild the I-285 bridges over Glenridge Drive, SR 400, and Peachtree Dunwoody Road
- Phase 1 implementation will be Fall 2022 – EB lanes will be closed first followed by WB lanes two weeks after
- This phase will take approximately four months



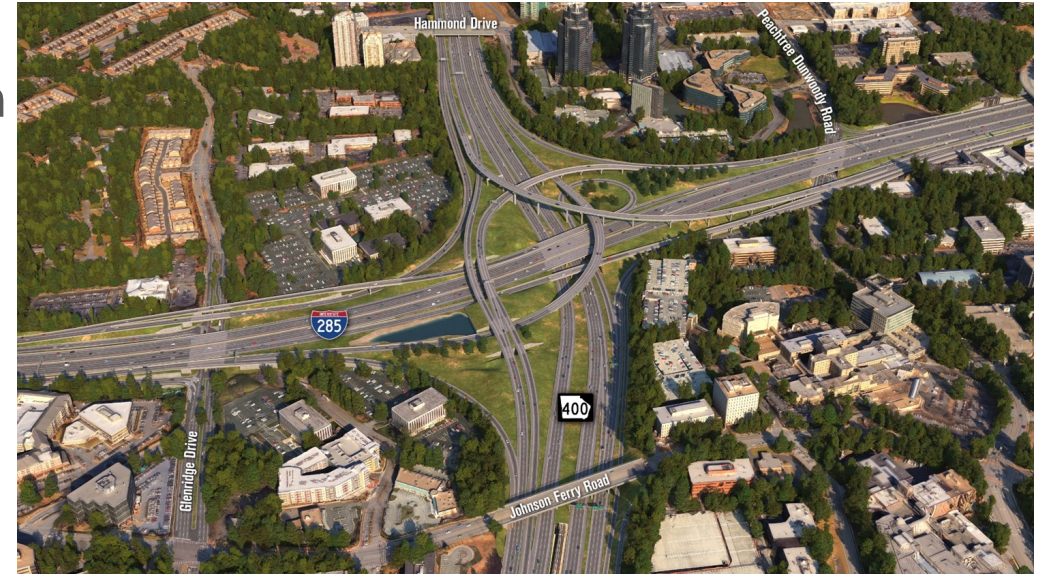
Glenridge Drive and Peachtree Dunwoody Road

- Lanes on Glenridge Drive and Peachtree Dunwoody Road will remain as they currently are
- The one-way couplet/pair that was discussed previously will not be utilized
- Full closures will be ongoing but limited to only one road at a time (nights and weekends only)



Project Milestones

- Opening elements of the project as they are complete, realizing safety and mobility benefits in real-time.
- Major openings of ramps, bridges, and CD Lanes will continue to open throughout 2022 and into 2023.
- Most work on I-285 mainline and on SR 400 is anticipated to be complete by the end of 2023.

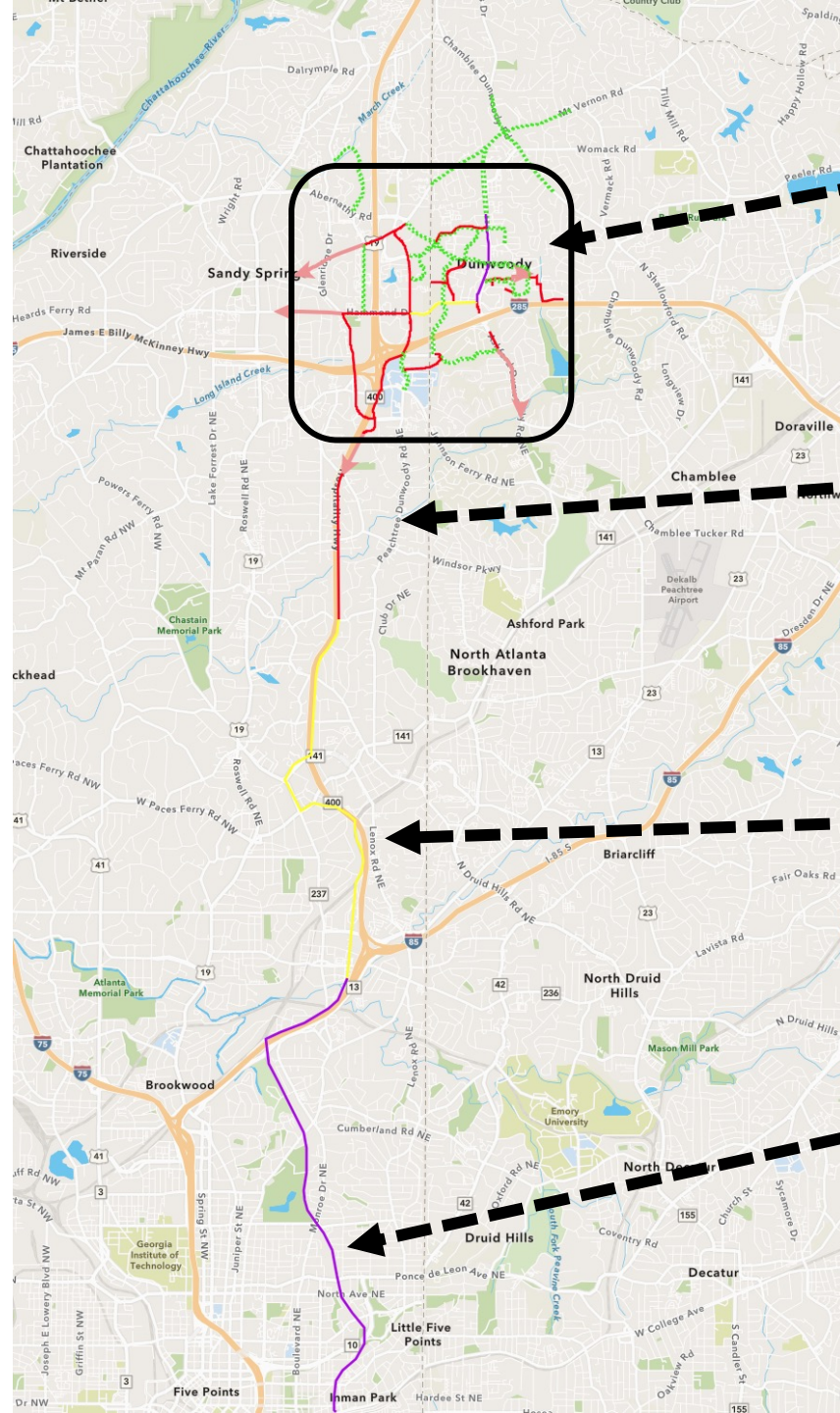

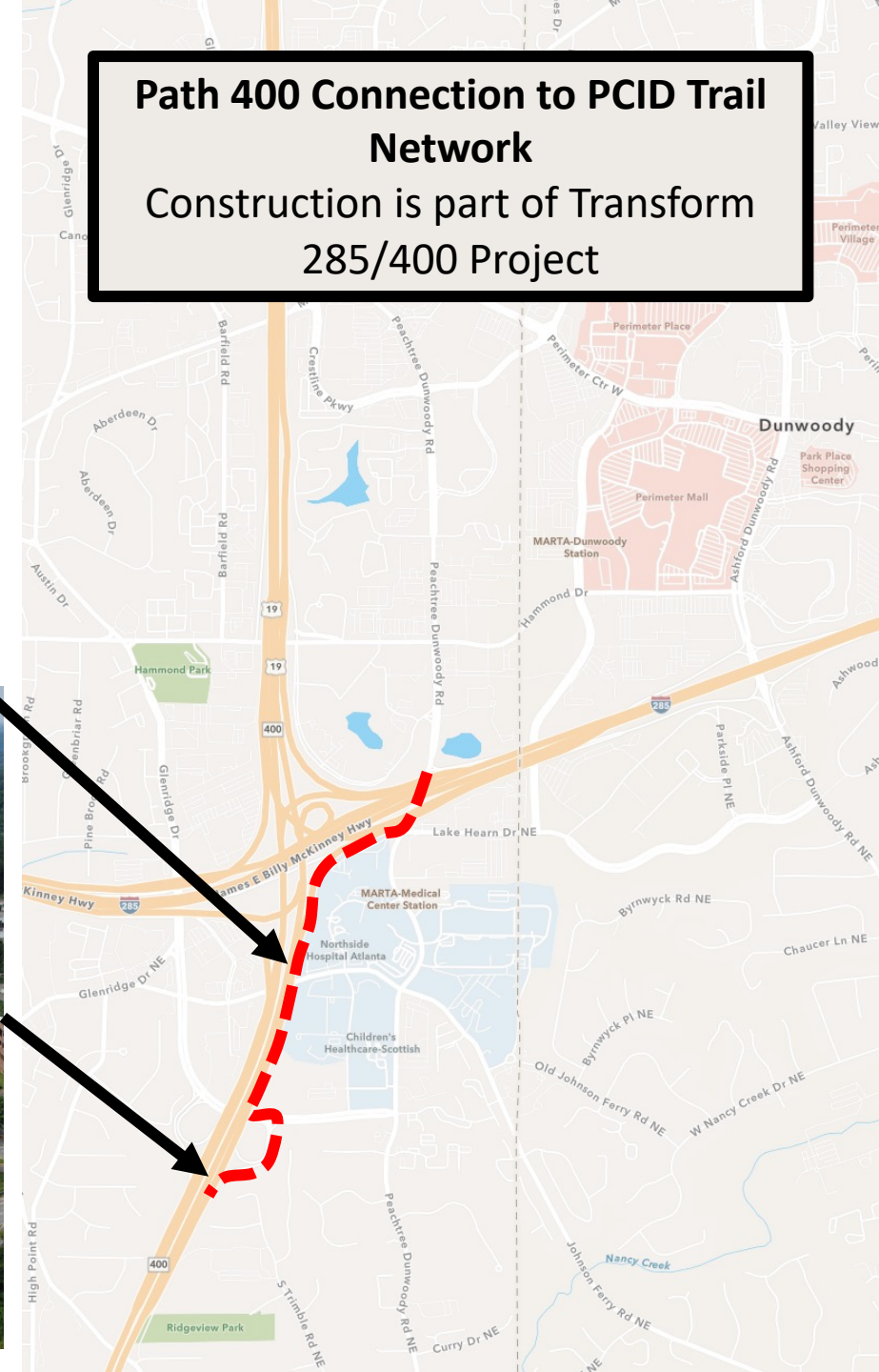

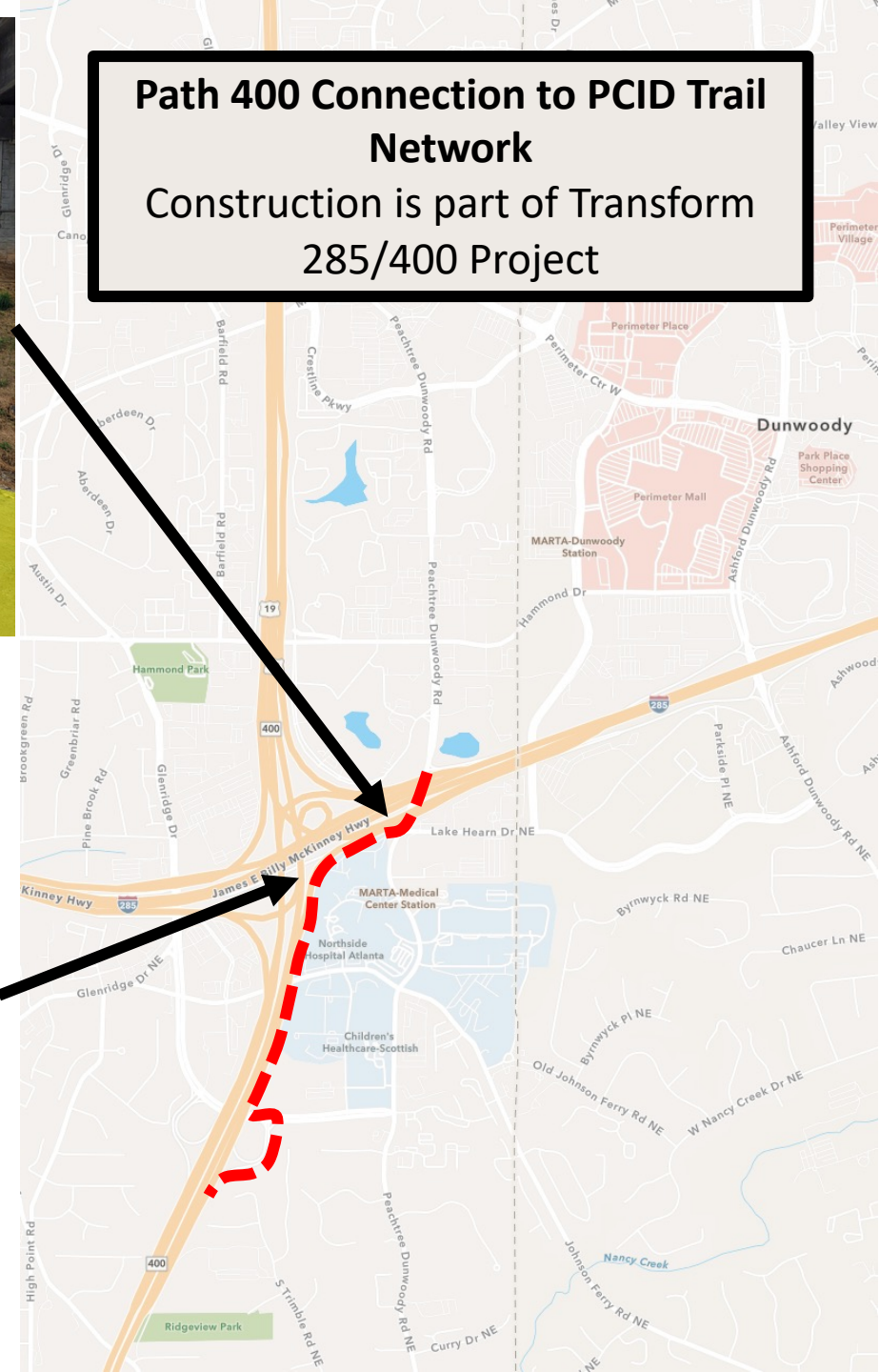

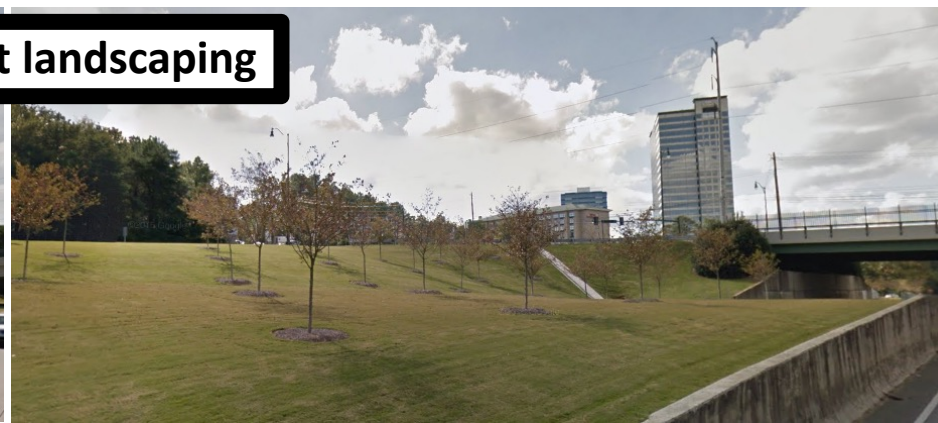

I-285 Lane Closures

The reconstruction of I-285 at GA-400 is getting closer to finished, but there's one last major step — and it's going to impact a lot of folks.

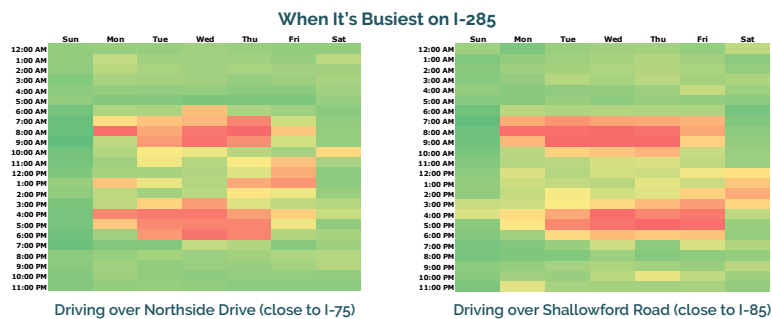
Starting in late October, the Georgia Department of Transportation will close two lanes in each direction of I-285 until late 2023. These closures will be 24/7. These are the affected areas:

Ask for Options

Reach out via the link or QR code below and we'll explore every possible alternative commute for you, based on where you live and work. There may be a comfy coach bus, easy vanpool, or carpooling coworker you didn't know about.

Shared the Ride - and Get Paid

If you carpool with a colleague or friend, we'll give you a \$50 gas card. Take that time on 285 and make it fly by. Hit up our link and we'll handle the hard work of finding you a carpool.

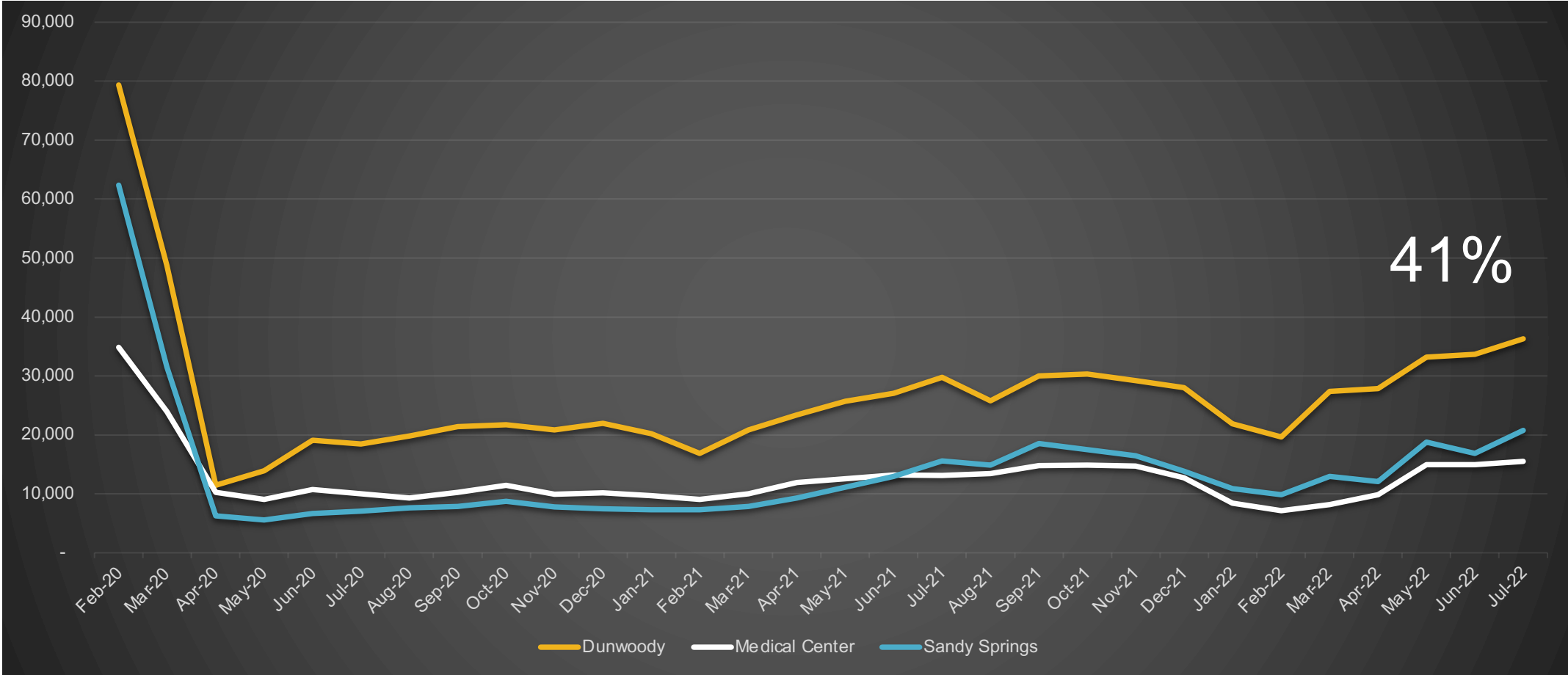
