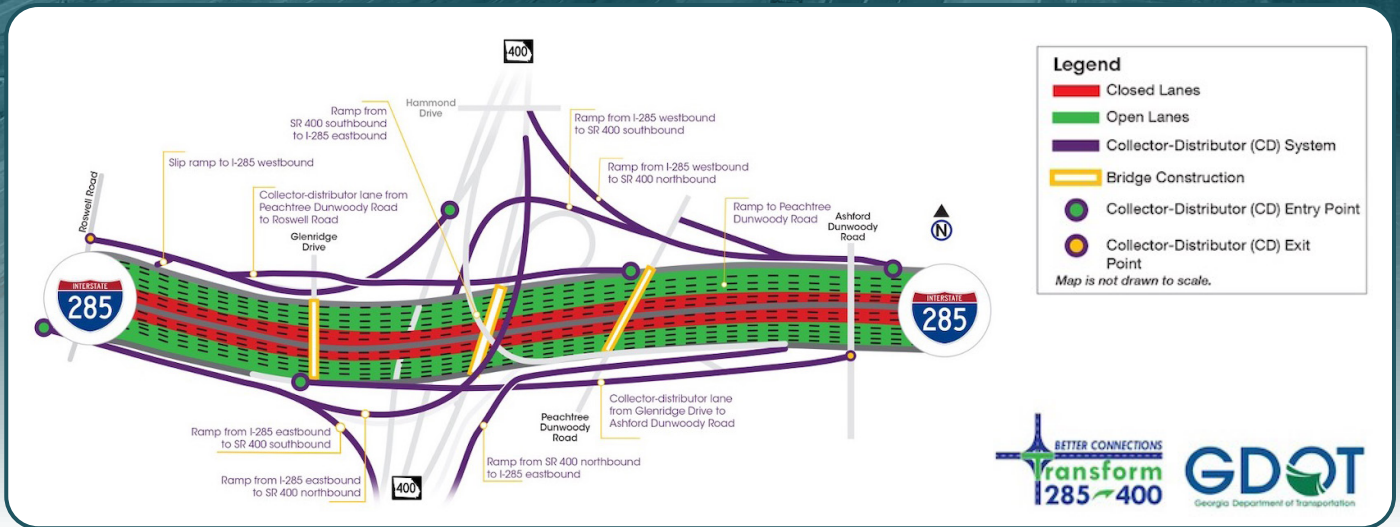


I-285 Lane Closures

The reconstruction of I-285 at GA-400 is getting closer to finished, but there's one last major step — and it's going to impact a lot of folks.

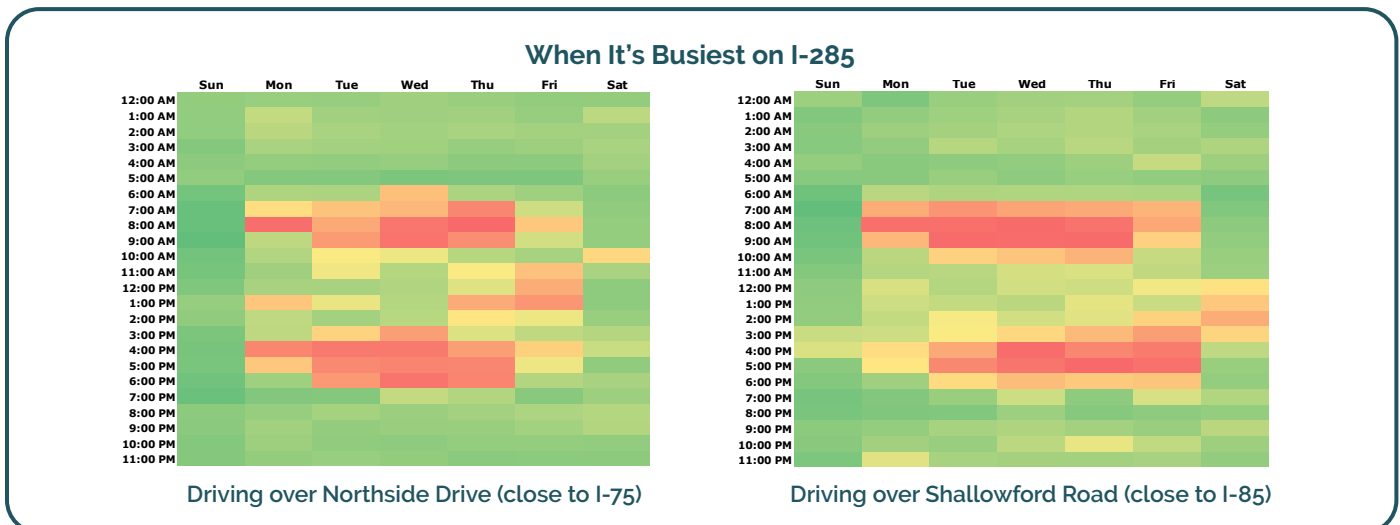
Starting as early as October 8th, the Georgia Department of Transportation will close two lanes in each direction of I-285 until late 2023. These closures will be 24/7. These are the affected areas:

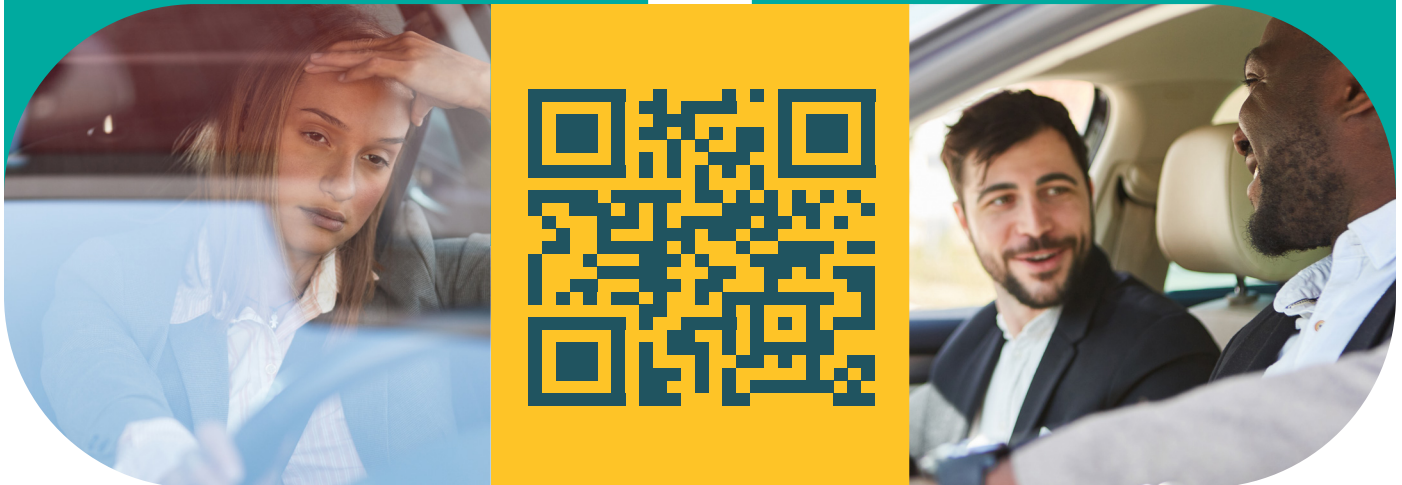
Ask for Options
